TRG Decennial Year Celebration

Transportation Research India Group celebrated the successful completion of its 10 Year Journey on 28th May, 2021. 10 year back, the foundation of TRG was laid when it got formally registered as a society. However, the idea of TRG was developed and evolved over a long period of 3 years. The very first meeting to discuss on such an initiative of collaboration was proposed and held during First Indo-US Symposium on Advances in Mass Transit and Travel Behaviour Research (MTTBR-08), which was organized by Dr. Ashish Verma (jointly with Prof. Ram Pendyala from Arizona State University, USA) at IIT Guwahati during February 12-15, 2008.



That is where this very important idea of forming a society of the name Transportation Research Group of India (TRG) emerged with its focus on furthering transportation research and academics in the country, and it was agreed to pursue and work on it further. Subsequent to this, more meetings in smaller groups were held at different occasions to discuss on formation of TRG and taking it further. However, this whole effort of forming TRG saw lots of ups and downs over a period of 3 years after which the establishment of TRG was finally announced in December 2010 and it got formally registered as a society on 28th May 2011, which in future will always be remembered and celebrated as the Foundation Day of TRG.

Words of wisdom by Keynote Speaker at TRG Decennial Year celebration



Prof. Kumares C. Sinha, Purdue University

Prof. Sinha remembered the memories of joint conference organized by transportation researchers of US and India held at IIT Guwahati. He reminded that how the area of traffic engineering, transit operations and transport planning grows. He recommended that research results should translated into operational practices and public policies to make research useful for society. He suggested TRG should reach out to IRC and other groups to work on common areas. He concluded his remarks by remembering Prof. B. B. Pandey of IIT Kharagpur who recently passed away.

Prof. V. Thamizh Arasan, IIT Madras



Prof. Arasan, Retired Professor, IIT Madras and Founder-Member of TRG, after being appreciative of the achievements of TRG India in a decade, made SWOT Analysis of TRG India. He suggested a few strategies as the way forward for the future of TRG India. They are: (i) Enhancing the membership of TRG on mission mode, (ii) Getting Scopus indexed status for the journal, TIDE of TRG and (iii) Modification of the name "Transportation Research Group Video of India' as "Transportation Research Society of India" as he felt that the word 'Group' refers to a small number of individuals involved in a certain activity, whereas TRG actually covers a large number of professional involved in Transportation research and practice in a larger country (India).

Dr. S. Gangopadhyay, Former Director CRRI



Former Director CRRI insisted on the importance and role of TRG and its formation. He recollected memories and collaborations of TRG-India with CRRI and events organized by CRRI as a part of TRG. He shared moments during release of Indo-HCM at CTRG-2013, when he was the Director of CRRI. He addressed Impacts of Covid Pandemic on life of common people and highlighted needs and expectation of society from transportation community. He suggested to summarize the outcomes of every CTRG and submitting those outcomes to the government as a report, so that they can utilize those outcome for policy making purpose. He thrusted TRG to promote and encourage collaborative research proposals between leading institutes.

Prof. G Raghuram, Director, IIMB



Prof. Raghuram conveyed his wishes to TRG India for completing 10 years and called TRG a highly sustainable transport research group. He recalled his presence during a 2008 meeting held at IIT, Guwahati where initial talks regarding the inception of TRG India took place. He remembered the young faculty who brought up this idea and put all their efforts to make TRG India a grand success. When the first TRG meeting happened in Bangalore, he recalled that what really took him into TRG was the quality with which it was done and the nature of sustained communication. He mentioned that quality is not just the choice of words or the functionality of the communication for such an event but the clean editing and formatting, followed with strict discipline. Seeing it grow over the years, he congratulated those who were putting in energy and wished them well. He also wished for more diversity in those involved in governance. He conveyed his greetings and wishes once again to TRG India.

Mr. Arun Shirole, Former President, ATPIO



Former President (ATPIO) briefed about the evolution of TRB and the collaborations of ATPIO with TRG. He mentioned five distinct areas where ATPIO and TRG have synergistically worked together, i.e., TRGs active participation in ATPIO annual meetings, free webinars on current topics, USA- India transportation research collaborations, ATPIO support and participation in CTRG, and specific areas of successful collaborative bilateral research. He mentioned that in last 10 years, ATPIO and TRG members have proactively collaborated in research resulting significant publications in four theme areas: (a) transportation challenges, strategies and trends, (b) transportation investment decision making, (c) highway safety and incident or disaster management, and (d) transit and resource allocation. In the concluding remarks, he said transportation infrastructure whether it is in the US or in India involves huge investment, so we got to protect and preserve it.

Use of plastic waste in bituminous mix in the construction of Service Roads along National Highways.

26th March, 2021

Ministry of Road Transport & Highways vide circular no. RW-NH-33044/24/2015-S&R (R) had issued the guidelines to encourage the use of plastic waste in the hot mix bituminous wearing coat. As per the latest circular, bituminous mix with waste plastic shall be the default mode for periodic renewal with hot mixes within 50 Kms periphery of urban area having population more than 5 lakhs. Further, the circular makes it mandatorily to use waste plastic for laying of wearing coat on Service Roads along National Highways within 50 kms periphery of urban area having population more than 5 lakhs also.



Government Makes Dual Airbags Mandatory For Vehicles

2nd March, 2021

Ministry has issued Gazette notification G.S.R 148 (E) regarding mandatory provision of an airbag for passenger seated on front seat of a vehicle, next to driver. This has been mandated as an important safety feature & is also based on suggestions of Supreme Court Committee on Road Safety. Vehicles manufactured on and after the 1st Day of April, 2021, in the case of new models, and



31st day of August, 2021, in the case of existing models, shall be fitted with airbag for the person occupying the front seat, other than the driver.

No vehicle conforming to emission standard of BS-IV to be sold or registered in the Country.

10th June, 2021

As per the direction of Hon'ble Supreme Court, Ministry of Road Transport & highway via its notification dated 10th June, 2021 has directed all the licensing and registering authorities to not register the vehicles conforming to the emission standards of BS-IV





Electric vehicles exempted from registration certificate fees

27th May, 2021

The Ministry of Road Transport and Highways vide notification G.S.R 352E has exempt battery operated vehicles from the payment of fees for the issue or renewal of registration certificate and assignment of new registration mark.


